There are times when the stars are in alignment and odd things happen. Such as hitting every light on red in Bucyrus or running into the only unlit ATON in West Harbor.


Things happen to us for a reason; we might not like it, but we can grow from the experience or dwell on

EDUCATIONAL OFFICER R/C Bob Rayburn, SN-IN



On October 24, 2024, several club instructors met to consider future planning for the education program. This was an open discussion to consider which courses, seminars and other educational activities we should consider for the future. The group discussed content choices, training, advertis-



ing, delivery methods and other items of interest to our group of instructors. The key question addressed is how we make our program more attractive to today's recreational boaters.

Several suggestions came out of the instructors' meeting. Case in point: accept that we must add teaching equipment and software to deliver content online. As one instructor stated, "Zoom is here to stay." One of the first suggestions was to create a Zoom Studio (presentation room) in one of the classrooms.

Another suggestion was to focus on the course materials that would attract local boaters. (Boat Handling - AP plus electives such as Engine Maintenance). Accept that we will have smaller classes.

There was discussion concerning the audience that we should focus on attracting as well as an interest in discovering who would be in that audience. Note that the national organization hired a firm to research the audience which would be attracted to our organization. That information is available to share. Much of the discussion focused on marketing and advertising. Doug Jackson recommended that we consider RevLocal, the digital marketing company, and contact R J Lowery. This is a local company which helped the Great Lakes Cruising Club with marketing efforts.

The final topic was about each member becoming an ambassador for the club. How do we attract and not repel members during meetings or other activities. Being welcoming means having a positive focus on the person. This is something we have the most control over!

Instructors are looking to make changes. While this is only the start of the journey, it is a good

2024 Trip to the Ohio River Moundsville, W.V.

Four boats and seven boaters left for the Ohio River at Moundsville, West Virginia on a bright sunny day in August.

Upon arriving in Moundsville, we went to the launch area and were met by Will, owner of the 101 Marina where we would be docking our boats during our weekend rendezvous. Will's dock was approximately a quarter mile from the launch area, and as we all launched our boats, Will took our tow vehicles and trailers one at a time and parked them on his lot.

After launching our boats, we went downstream for a couple miles then stopped for lunch as we drifted ever so slowly downstream on a flat calm river. Later, we continued the trip downstream to Hannibal Lock and Dam, but did not lock through. Construction workers were working on the large chamber which required the tugs, barges and pleasure boaters to go through the same smaller lock. After floating for a period, we headed back upstream to our docks. Upon arriving at the dock, we tied up and drove to the Holiday Day Inn Express to check in.

We stayed at this Holiday Inn Express on another rendezvous and found the rooms were clean, spacious with friendly staff. After showering, and changing clothes, we went to the Prima Marina Restaurant for dinner. Everyone seemed to have

had a pleasant meal, as no one had complaints about what they ordered or the quality of their meal. The food was great, and I would highly recommend the restaurant.

The following day, we boated upstream through Wheeling, West Virginia where we observed the USS LST 325, the last fully operational landing ship tank that participated in several battles during World War II, including the Invasion of Normandy. We then continued upstream to the Pike Island and Dam, located in Yorkville, Ohio.

Upon returning to the hotel, they served everyone a delicious chicken pot pie with homemade biscuits in the lounge area at no cost. I don't believe any of us ever experienced anything like this in the past and the hotel kept bringing out slow cooker after slow cooker of chicken pot pie. Later a birthday cake appeared with ice cream to top off the dinner, and I would like to thank all our boaters for their well wishes. After eating as much as we could, we decided to go to the hot tub and pool which was a pleasing adventure.

The following day, we again boated upstream to Wheeling, WV on a near glass smooth river, with not a ripple on the water.

For the three days, we traveled 112 miles and had six hours, forty-two minutes on the water. What a great three days!
