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COMMANDER'S MESSAGE Cdr Larry R. Whiting, P

"Making Headway" is our Squadron theme for the year, and after the February Executive Committee meeting I feel we are indeed making headway to achieve our goals for the year.

The trend is great: We have a goal of 100 vessel safety checks. We already have five additional squadron members who want to become certified as vessel examiners. We have 56 students registered for the public Safe Boating Course. That's the highest number we have had in several years. And, the evidence indicates about a third of these students learned about the courses from the boat show, a third from newspaper advertising, and a third from Squadron members or others. Our classrooms are active with a couple dozen members taking and teaching Squadron courses. The web site is current with several new features. I am hopeful the Roster will be updated very soon. We have some interesting and modestly priced dinner meetings coming up in an attempt to increase attendance. Larry Lowe's leader-



ship in looking at Squadron challenges is reaping some new ideas for membership recruitment and involvement. Bob Prior and Larry Lowe are also going to head a committee to develop a five-year strategic plan. And, this spring we will be teaching a seminar between Headquarters and a second location with our Remote Education System. We also have an exciting array

of rendezvous planned for both Lake Erie boaters and trailer boaters.

We are "on a roll." Let's keep it going. Let's come together and celebrate at the Commander's Ball 12 April.

Your Executive Committee agreed in the February meeting to press forward with the creation of a comprehensive *Strategic Business Plan* for the squadron. This undertaking is designed to construct a road map to guide and focus the activities of the squadron for the next 1-3 years and a committee is being formed to write it.

The completed plan will contain the following components:

V. <u>OBJECTIVES, STRATEGY AND TACTICS</u>. Defines what is to be done - - when and how.

<u>VI.</u> <u>CONTINGENCY PLANNING</u>. A listing of *potential disasters* that might strike the squadron and what actions must be taken in response in order to insure that the squadron survives into the future.

In as much as the squadron does not have a Strategic Plan in place, it will undoubtedly take several months to complete. Our goal is to wrap it up by late fall.

Larry Lowe and I have agreed to chair this project and we are enthusiastic about its possibilities. Looking at the above list of components, if you find one that particularly interests you, please contact Larry or me; we would welcome your assistance.

I would like to thank everyone who attended the March dinner meeting. Attendance was beyond my expectations and the program was quite entertaining for all. We had so much fun we were all in knots. The April event is the Commander's Ball at the Crowne Plaza in Dublin. I am looking forward to seeing everyone in their beach formal wear while being entertained by 176 Keys. May 1st will be a catered dinner at squadron headquarters. Look in this issue for RSVP information. The Sea Gals will host the June dinner meeting. Location TBD. Come have fun with us on the water and out on the town.

As I look outside to see the snow falling, all I can dream about is getting my boat out of storage and hitting the local waters. Before the spring launch, I must do a few things to prepare for the season. My primary concern is safety for my boat, crew and passengers. I plan to get my boat a free Vessel Safety Check (VSC) by one of the 5 current examiners within our squadron.

Before I have my boat examined, I must verify a few items. First I want to make sure my registration numbers are in good shape and the registration sticker has not expired. Then I will check my PFD's to verify I have enough on board for all passenger sizes and they are in good and serviceable condition. I want to make certain they are readily accessible in case of an emergency – not stowed in plastic bags or a locked cabinet.

Next, I check my visual distress signals (flags and flares) for their shape and expiration date. All fire extinguishers should be readily accessible and properly charged. Any dry chemical extinguishers should be removed from the bracket, turned upside down and shaken. This will dislodge any solids from the bottom. The sound producing devices for distress signaling include the horn, a whistle and a siren. A loose wire could cause a malfunction and I would not pass my safety check.

I will check that my blower is working for ventilation purposes. I do not want gas vapors in the bilge since they could cause an explosion. I must check my backfire flame arrester on top of the carburetor to verify it is still there and is in clean, working order.

My boat should be able to display its navigation lights and an all around anchor light between sunset and sunrise and also in conditions of reduced visibility. I will check all lights and replace as needed burned bulbs and fuses.

required for boats 26' and over. Even though my 20' boat does not require these two items, I do have them on board. The maximum capacity placard is available to view as well.

Since my boat does not have a head, the sanitation device requirements do not apply. However, make sure yours is Coast Guard approved and the overboard discharge outlet is capable of being sealed. For boats over 39'4" or larger a current copy of the navigation rules are required.

Now that my boat is ready for inspection, I want to check my trailer. Even though this is not part of the VSC, common sense tells me to check my tire condition and pressure, the wheel bearings, brakes including lines, and my lighting system.

With this pre-check complete, I feel confident my boat will pass the VSC. My next step is to contact one of the 5 current examiners within the Columbus Sail & Power Squadron. I understand there are 2-3 CSPS members who are studying to become examiners for the 2008 season.







Inflatable PFD'S... Automatic or Manual

The boating season is only about a month away and if you are considering buying a new life jacket (PFD), here is a question you should ask yourself before swiping your credit card.

Should I buy an automatic or a manual inflatable PFD. The inflatable PFD's are much less cumbersome and easier to wear that a standard PFD. Here are some things to consider before you go to your local marine supply store to purchase one.

Before deciding between water activated (automatic) and a manually activated (pull cord, blow up) PFD, consider the storage and maintenance aspects.

The automatic (water activated) triggers used in inflatable PFD's are dependent upon a water-soluble bobbin. This bobbin is used to retain a spring which, when released, impacts the firing pin of the inflator valve causing the CO2 cylinder to be punctured and inflating the air chamber of the PFD. When the PFD is inflated manually, it is a simple pulling of a ripcord that causes the firing pin to activate. Both styles of PFD's also have an oral inflation tube that allows you to fill the chamber by blowing into it.

In the event of an unconscious victim, automatic inflation is desirable. It is important to know though that these systems must be maintained. Automatic systems are known to be unstable because of the constant force of the spring in combination with the bobbin that is affected by temperature and humidity. These variables have been known to cause PFD's to suddenly inflate without immersion, as well as to not inflate due to changes in the bobbin that render it insoluble.

Which ever PFD you decide is best for you, the decision will be a good one.

Nautical Dictionary: Lunch Hook

A nautical expression pertaining to anchoring for lunch, or a short period of time in which the boat will not be left unattended. In this situation the "lunch hook" can be a smaller anchor than used for overnight or unattended anchorages in calm water. When dropping the lunch hook, a scope of 5:1 is often used instead of the usual 7:1 or larger. In using the smaller anchor and shorter scope, retrieval is easier.

The Lunch Hook Rendezvous (previously known as the Lake Erie Anchor Out) on 23 August, will be an ideal place to use this tactic. Be sure to check next month's *Galley Gossip* for more details on this fun-filled one-day event.
